Entrances are included to Edinburgh Castle only to allow for flexibility.

Edinburgh Castle is one of the most exciting historic sites in Western Europe, set in the heart of Scotland's dynamic capital city it is sure to capture your imagination. The scenery will take your breath away. Standing on its great rock, Edinburgh Castle dominates Scotland's capital. Great events have taken place within its walls, and it has witnessed many sieges. To control the castle was to hold the keys to the kingdom. Iron Age warriors understood the rock's military potential and built a hill fort here. The castle is now a world-famous visitor attraction and a key element of the Edinburgh World Heritage Site.



DAY 3**PRIVATE DAY TOUR TO ST ANDREWS**

After breakfast this morning, meet with your driver/guide for a full day travelling east into the Kingdom of Fife and to St Andrews. Enjoy some local sightseeing with the driver. You will see the Castle and the University and of course the Old Course. In the late afternoon, return to Edinburgh for an evening at your leisure.

St. Andrews: Standing proudly on the east coast and within half an hour from Dundee and less than two hours from Edinburgh and Glasgow, it's easy to explore this historic gem in the Kingdom of Fife. St Andrews, Scotland's world-famous Home of Golf, is known for its historic university, medieval streets and gorgeous traditional buildings. The town is filled with exciting things to see and do, from St Andrews Cathedral to nearby Scotland's Secret Bunker. Discover the town's fascinating past, explore its stunning surroundings and experience golfing history in the place where it all began - and with 10 fantastic courses to choose from including the renowned Old Course, St Andrews is an unmissable experience for any golfer.



DAY 4

EDINBURGH TO INVERNESS WITH DALWHINNIE DISTILLERY



Check out of your hotel and meet a driver/guide and travel North towards Inverness. Suggested stop at South Queensferry to get a great view of the Forth Bridges and it's a beautiful little village. From there possibly stop off at the small town of Dunkeld close to the "Little Houses" (an area renovated and looked after by the National Trust) and take a wander up the lane leading to Dunkeld Cathedral which is located on the shore of the River Tay (very picturesque). Then on through Pitlochry and you may wish to stop for a visit to Blair Castle followed by lunch in a nearby pub. After lunch, we will include a stop for a scheduled tour and tasting at the Dalwhinnie Whiskey Distillery. Arrive in Inverness in the afternoon and check in to your hotel for an evening at leisure.

DAY 5

PRIVATE LOCH NESS CRUISE AND LOCAL SIGHTSEEING

This morning you will meet with your driver who will bring you to the boarding area (Urquhart Bay harbour which is 1 mile north of Drumnadrochit on the A82) for a private 1-hour cruise on Loch Ness. There will be plenty of photo opportunities so a camera today is a must! After the cruise, meet your driver and travel to Urquhart Castle for an included visit. Spend the afternoon sightseeing with your driver/guide. You can discuss options with him on the day, The battlefield at Culloden Moor is a great visit (payable locally). Return to Inverness for an evening at your leisure.

Private Loch Ness Cruise (1 Hour): Join a local skipper for a trip lasting approximately one hour and enjoy stunning views of the Great Glen, Loch Ness and the ruins of Urquhart Castle. On board, instruments monitor sub surface activity showing both bottom profile and mid water targets, which, although usually fish, are very very occasionally much larger and not readily explained. Fun Facts, Legends and History galore from your host Gordon as you enjoy the very best views from the Loch.



Urquhart Castle. Once one of Scotland's largest castles, Urquhart saw great conflict during its 500 years as a medieval fortress. Control of the castle passed back and forth between the Scots and English during the Wars of Independence. The power struggles continued, as the Lords of the Isles regularly raided both castle and glen up until the 1500s. The last of the government troops garrisoned here during the Jacobite Risings blew up the castle when they left. Urquhart's iconic ruins remain, offering glimpses into medieval times and the lives of its noble residents.



Culloden Moor Visitor Centre. Visit the powerfully moving site of the final Jacobite Rising – the last and most harrowing pitched battle to be fought on British soil. The richly researched, stimulating and sensitive Culloden Visitor Centre, which stands beside the battlefield, features artefacts from both sides of the battle and interactive displays that reveal the background to the conflict. It stands as a monument and a guide to a pivotal day in history. Discover how a bloody fight that lasted only an hour changed life in the Highlands forever. A visit to Culloden is a poignant experience.

DAY 6

INVERNESS TO THE ISLE OF SKYE



This morning you will meet your driver/guide for a full day tour to the Isle of Skye. En-route you will see the most photographed castle in the world, Eilean Donan. The island of Skye, connected to Scotland's northwest coast by bridge, is known for its rugged landscapes, picturesque fishing villages and medieval castles. The largest island in the Inner Hebrides archipelago, it has an indented coastline of peninsulas and narrow lochs, radiating out from a mountainous interior. Spend the afternoon exploring the wonderful Island and the spectacular scenery. In the late afternoon you will arrive at your hotel and the evening is at your leisure.

The Island of Skye is 50 miles long and the largest of the Inner Hebrides. The capital is Portree. Villages in the north of the Island include Dunvegan, Edinbane, Uig and Staffin. Notable villages in the south of Skye include Broadford, Armadale, Carbost, Elgol and Kyleakin. The Island has a rich History covering many topics, such as: dinosaur fossils, clan warfare, Highland Clearances and the infamous Bonnie Prince Charlie and the Jacobite Rebellion. Both Clan MacDonald and Clan MacLeod have their Clan castles on the Island and should be on your list of places to visit. The Isle of Skye is also a great destination for Wildlife watching with the white-tailed sea eagle at the top of bird watchers lists. Otters, seals, whales, dolphins and red deer are just some of the other impressive creatures that can be seen on and around the Isle of Skye

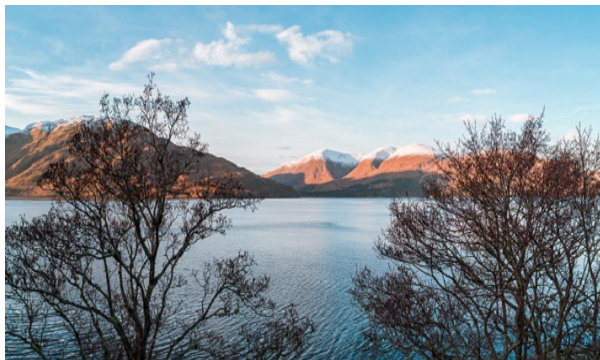
DAY 8

TRAVEL FROM SKYE TO GLASGOW VIA FORT WILLIAM, GLENCOE AND LOCH LOMOND



This morning you will check out of your hotel and take the morning ferry for the 45-minute journey from Armadale to Mallaig admiring the spectacular scenery as you go. Travel to Fort William via Glenfinnan and time to see the monument to Bonnie Prince Charlie and the Viaduct. You will see the majestic Glencoe and enjoy time for an optional lunch before continuing south via the Bridge of Orchy and Crianlarich and along the bonny banks of Loch Lomond. In the evening you will arrive in Glasgow and check into your hotel. The evening is at your leisure to relax and explore.

The Glenfinnan Viaduct is a renowned feat of Victorian engineering and the longest concrete railway bridge in Scotland. It takes the West Highland Railway over the River Finnan 100ft below, on its journey between Fort William and Mallaig – and is one of the most picturesque train rides in the world. Built in the 1890s by ‘Concrete Bob’ McAlpine, the viaduct’s 21 huge arches were constructed using pioneering technology at the time. From our viewpoints, you can marvel at the sight and sound of the *Jacobite* steam train traversing the hillside and crossing the Viaduct. Made famous by the *Harry Potter* films as the *Hogwarts Express*, you can witness this moment in spring to autumn, although our local rail service makes this same journey all year round.



Fortwilliam is known as the outdoor capital of the Scottish Highlands with its stunning landscapes, fascinating museums and authentic ales and whiskeys. There is a huge range of outdoors activities to suit every ability from mountain climbing, water sports to fishing and walking to name but a few.

Glencoe: The alluring Glencoe Valley in the Scottish Highlands is most popular due to its waterfalls, peaking trails such as Buachaille Etive More and Bidean nam Bian. It is also adored for its variety of wildlife. If you wish to visit the Glencoe Folk Museum within the village, there sits 18th-century thatched cottages with displays on local heritage and the Glencoe massacre of 1692. The surrounding lush environment is sure to enchant anyone.





Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park: The National Park is famous for a reason: the scenery is stunning. From the Arrochar Alps to the island habitats of Loch Lomond, the views from the top of Ben Lomond to the Falls of Dochart, there's a breath-taking view practically everywhere you go. At the heart of the park is Loch Lomond itself. You won't find a bigger loch or lake in the whole of Britain, and you'll have a hard time finding a more beautiful one, too. You have the option to take a cruise on the waters and admire the

mighty bulk of Ben Lomond, Scotland's most southerly Munro, as well as the jagged shoulders of the Arrochar Alps. You could maybe even visit one of the loch's 30 islands. You might get a surprise when you pass Inchconnachan - those aren't giant squirrels you can see, but wallabies! The island has had a colony of the Antipodean creatures happily hopping there since the 1940s. At the southern end of the water is Loch Lomond Shores, surely one of the most beautifully situated shopping destinations in Britain. You can browse famous Scottish brands and pick up some fine local fare.

Glasgow: Scotland's most populated City sits on the banks of the Clyde and is well known for its excellent shopping, food and nightlife and various tourist attractions and landmarks. Home to Scottish Opera, Scottish Ballet and the National Theatre of Scotland, as well as acclaimed museums and a thriving music scene.

After your first Irish breakfast, you'll meet our friendly local guide in the hotel lobby. They'll take you on an informative private morning walking tour of Dublin City. Taking in many key sights and buildings within Dublin city, you'll welcome this informative insight into the capital city's history and local life. Should you have any specific points of interest, or mobility needs, we'll happily accommodate them for you.

Custom House opened in 1791 at Dublin Port. Rich in neoclassical architecture, you'll learn about it on this tour. Dublin Castle is another feature. Dating to the 13th century, it's been a major government centre since independence in 1922. And the Georgian doors of Dublin are a popular "must-see". You'll love seeing their colour and decoration first-hand, an important part of Dublin's history.

The walking tour will end at Trinity College Library with timed entrance to The Book of Kells Experience. The rest of the day is free to discover more Dublin highlights at your leisure. There's much to see and we'll help you plan your time. Perhaps the National Gallery is of interest? Or the Irish Immigration Museum? And there's plenty of fantastic shopping on offer too.



The Book of Kells Experience: Explore Trinity's Old Library and view the world-famous Book of Kells. DUBLIN TO CORK: HISTORIC LAND OF SAINTS & SCHOLARS

With so much more to discover in South-West Ireland, you'll depart from Dublin today. Your destination is Cork, 265km across gorgeous scenery and past many places of interest. Accompanied by your trusted driver-guide, you'll travel in the safety of your luxury vehicle. We include entrance fees to The Rock of Cashel and Blarney Castle as you travel today.

The Rock of Cashel – situated on distinctive limestone outcrops within the Golden Vale, St Patrick chose the location for his head of church in Ireland. You'll see a group of medieval fortifications here – most significant in Ireland's history.

Blarney Castle – you might have heard about the legendary Stone of Eloquence? Kiss it, and words will never fail you. Since 1446, the stone has been homed in the tower at Blarney Castle – built 600 years ago and now a world landmark here in Ireland.

To complete your adventurous day, you'll arrive at Kinsale Harbour and check in to Perryville House (or similar). It's a sumptuous boutique guest house and you'll admire the comfort of your deluxe room, coupled with a lovingly restored building that dates to 1820. There's no compromise here!



The Rock of Cashel: The site where St. Patrick chose to make the head of his church in Ireland. The Rock of Cashel is a spectacular group of medieval buildings set on an outcrop of limestone in the Golden Vale including the 12th century round tower, High Cross and Romanesque Chapel, 13th century Gothic cathedral, 15th century Castle and the restored Hall of the Vicars Choral.



Blarney Castle: Built nearly six hundred years ago by one of Ireland's greatest chieftains, Cormac MacCarthy. Over the last few hundred years, millions have flocked to Blarney making it a world-famous landmark and one of Ireland's greatest treasures. Now, that might have something to do with the Blarney Stone, the legendary Stone of Eloquence, found at the top of the tower. Kiss it and you'll never again be lost for words.

Built as a tourist resort, you'll reach Killarney during the afternoon (perhaps earlier, dependent on your route). On the shores of Lough Leane, Queen Victoria stayed in Killarney in 1750. THE RING OF KERRY

This is a circular route that forms part of The Wild Atlantic Way. And there's so many hidden gems to point out to you.



First-stop is Killorglin, travelling through the sweet coastal village of Glenbeigh. Here you'll find one of the best sandy Atlantic beaches Ireland can offer. There's so much more to see on the Ring of Kerry. We recommend Dingle Bay, with its clean, sandy beaches, towering cliffs and crashing waves. Your driver-guide knows all the best viewpoints – photographers will be in paradise here. You'll keep going and keep discovering. Cahirciveen is the birthplace of Daniel O'Connell, Ireland's Great Liberator. And Skellig Ring is a fantastic detour if time allows (some say it's more tranquil than

the Ring of Kerry). This route can take you to Valentia Island. Well worth the effort. And not just to catch sight of Skellig Island – a key location for the latest Star Wars films.

Still, you'll discover awe-inspiring and rugged beauty as you pass through Sneem village and on to Molls Gap. There are staggering views of South-West Ireland from this winding mountain pass that elevates through the peaks.

Killarney National Park is now within reach, and you'll return to Killarney during the afternoon (perhaps later if you enjoyed Skellig Ring too). There's more to see in Killarney, such as Muckross House & Gardens or Torc Waterfall. Or you might just want to kick off your shoes back at the hotel. Tonight, why don't we organise a fantastic Irish music and dance show for you? The Celtic Steps perform in Killarney and your driver-guide can arrange everything. Or maybe a quiet meal is more in order? We can arrange that too

DAY 14

THE DINGLE PENINSULA

Starting and finishing at the attractive harbour town of Dingle, there's no shortage of sheltered sandy beaches, ancient archaeological sites and rugged landscape to admire. You can try and imagine how the Neolithic settlers made this wonderful place their home, back in 4,000BC.



Dingle offers plenty of choice for lunch. It might be local seafood fare or other delicious foods. And you'll be glad of your driver-guide here, given that traditional Irish is the first language. It sits firmly within one of the Gaeltacht regions. What an enchanting place to experience traditional Irish life! Your route back to Killarney includes the Conor Pass to Tralee. Sit back and drink in the views as your driver-guide addresses the winding climbs and magnificent peaks with ease. You'll soon be back at your hotel now.

DAY 15

KILLARNEY TO CLARE WITH FERRY AND CLIFFS OF MOHER

This morning you'll say goodbye to Killarney and travel north to the coastal town of Tarbet. Here, you'll take a short ferry journey across the Shannon estuary and join another section of The Wild Atlantic Way. Your first destination? The Cliffs of Moher.

Afterwards, travel through The Burren National Park before afternoon arrival at the magnificent 5-star Dromoland Castle. A sight to behold as you drive up to it in total comfort. What a treat! An original ancestral home, dating back to the 16th century, sense the depth of history as you relax in luxurious style. There's an intimate spa, 450 acres and heavenly cuisine. The Cliffs of Moher: A sheer precipice that stretches for 5 miles along another part of the Wild Atlantic Way. The Cliffs of Moher rise to a height of 668 feet above the Atlantic and is one of the most impressive coastlines in Ireland. In nesting season, the cliffs are home to a variety of seabirds. Entrances to the Cliffs of Moher Visitors Centre is included. In the afternoon, there will be time to see the Burren Region a remarkable landscape of Limestone and littered with Neolithic sites dating back 6,000 years.
